Philippine Coast Guard celebrates 113th Founding Anniversary

Our partner the Philippine Coast Guard celebrated its 113th Founding Anniversary with several activities highlighted by the Anniversary Day Program with no less than his Excellency President Benigno S. Aquino as Guest of Honor.

This year's celebration started with a PCG Family Run on a Saturday 04 October 2014, participated by thousands of runners including about a hundred from PCGA's different Auxiliary Districts, of course mostly by Officers and Auxiliarist from PCGA CGADNCR-CL. The Fun run was held at the CCP Complex with runners in Orange Shirts.

On the next Monday 06 October 2014, A Concert at the Robinsons Malate Mall was held featuring the PCG Symphonic Orchestra and Band. Both instrumental ensemble played classic, modern and pop music to the astonishment and delight of shoppers and guests. A static display of PCG assets were also held on the side. The event was a success with PCG awareness and goodwill established.

The Commandant's Mess Night was also held last 08 October 2014 at the Palasyo De Manila with VADM Rodolfo Isorena PCG as host. It was well attended by PCG Officers and their spouses, as well as by invited PCGA Officers, all dressed in formal Mess Jacket attire. The night started with formalities, dinner and teasting. It was capped by good music and of course dancing. It was a night to remember.

The Anniversary Celebration's highlight is the Anniversary Day program held last 16 October 2014 at HQPCG. In his Welcome Remarks PCG Commandant VADM Isorena PCG rendered a report showcasing the superior performance and achievements of the PCG. His Excellency President Aquino lauds the PCG and recognized the vital role of PCG in safeguarding and ensuring maritime peace and security in the 36,289 km total Philippine coastline.

The President also mentioned several PCG modernization initiatives being undertaken by

the government with the acquisition of latest equipment to enhance its operation which includes: 40 rubber boats and 300 aluminum boats for search and rescue operations, 40-meter Multi-Role Responsive Vessels from Japan as part of Maritime Safety Capability Improvement Project which will be delivered in installment with the first vehicle arriving in October 2015, and the target purchase of two additional medium helicopters in 2015. He also witnessed the presentation of the agency's newly acquired assets and equipment. The President was also pleased to announce the completion of National Coast Watch Center in April 2015.

With the theme: "Matuwid na Pagtatanod Baybayin Tungo sa Maayos at Mapayapang Karagatan," the event highlights the conferment of awards to deserving Coast Guard officers and personnel as well as civilian entities that have rendered commendable and brilliant services in the conduct of various PCG-related activities and missions.

PCGA Officers and Units Recognized

The PCG Anniversary Celebration highlights with PCG giving Awards and Recognition of valuable contributions and performance of PCG personnel, as well as Civilian employees and of course to PCGA partners. For the first time all the PCGA Traditional Awards and Unit Citations were given. The Commandant VAdm Isorena PCG and the His Excellency President Aquino handed the trophies and plaques to deserving PCGA Officers and Units.

PCGA CGADNCR-CL was adjudged as this year's Best Auxiliary District of the Year. This is due to their collective efforts in the conduct of various activities such as Relief Operations during the aftermath of Typhoons Yolanda, Maring and Habagat, conduct of Trainings / Info Drive on MAREP, WASAR trainings, Leadership and management seminar and others. CGADNCR-CL was also awarded with the Commandant's Unit Citation due to their sterling performance and active involvement in PCG and PCGA operations. The award gives the distinction to CGADNCR-CL as the recipient of said award in Y2012 and now Y2014, the only two (2) times that said award was given to an Auxiliary District.

The Commandant in his acceptance speech said that he would create a selection committee to make sure that the PCG beneficiaries will be properly selected and deserving.

The scholarship grant will be available to deserving PCG personnel and their dependents.

The scholarship grants were made possible through the initiative of Commo Beth Salabas PCGA, the Support Director for Community Relations, and concurrently the President of the Philippine Association of Maritime Institutes (PAMI). The scholarship grants came from different maritime schools operated by PCGA Officers and/or PAMI members. In Luzon, the Asian Institute of Maritime Studies (AIMS), Bicol Maritime Merchant Marine Academy, Celtech College, Fernandez College of Arts and Technology, NYK-TDk Maritime Academy, Our Lady of Fatima University, and University of Saint Anthony. In Visayas, St Therese MTC College, and the VMA Global College & Training Center, and in Mindanao the DMMA College for a combined 111+++ slots. AIMS through CommoLino and Capt Arlene Paderanga gave an additional twenty (20) scholarship grants for PCG personnel who needs to complete their units for graduation.

The month of October has been a particularly busy month for the PCGA, for it was a month of activities and celebrations commemorating the 113rd founding of the Philippine Coast Guard. A fun run was held on October 4 at the CCP area, with no less than the Commandant himself leading the event. Aside from participants from the PCG, about a hundred officers and men from the PCGA also joined the event. After the fun run, the Commandant, together with his Vice Commandant for Administration Radm Cecil Chen and several senior PCG officers, visited and had breakfast with the PCG detachment right beside our PCGA Headquarters at the CCP Bay Terminal. Several of our PCGA officers also joined in, led by the CGADNCRCL Director RadmValentinPrieto Jr. The Commandant also graced the concert performed by the PCG Symphonic Band at the Robinson's Mall in Manila in the afternoon of October 6. In the evening of October 8, the Commandant hosted the Officer's Ball, a formal event that saw the wearing of the official dinner jacket both by the PCG and the PCGA officers in attendance. It was a very memorable evening attended by several PCGA officers.

A special event was held at the PCG Headquarters on October 10 wherein we turned over more than a hundred scholarship grants to the Commandant. These scholarships were intended for deserving dependents of the men and women of the PCG who have less in life. Spearheading the campaign for scholarships were our very own Commo Elizabeth Salabas and CommoLinoPaderanga, whose respective schools contributed the bulk of the scholarship slots. For the information of everyone, this scholarship drive will be an ongoing undertaking of the PCGA as we continue to find new ways of assisting the PCG even outside of the four functional areas. This day also marked the promotion and shoulder board donning of three NAMO officers, the last to be elevated to the rank of Commodore. They were MARSAR Director Commo Salvador Tiangco Jr., MARSAF Director Commo Philip Chien, and INTERNAL AFFAIRS Director Commo Jose Baltazar.

Of course, the culmination of the long celebration is the Anniversary itself, which was held on October 16 with no less than His Excellency, President Benigno Simeon Aquino III as the Guest of Honor. The PCGA was well recognized that day with special mention coming from the Commandant during his speech. Awards were given to the PCGA with Commo Elizabeth Salabas bagging the Officer of the Year award; the CGADNCRCL winning the District of the Year award; Squadron 602nd getting the Squadron of the Year award and the 602.2 Division getting the Division of the Year Award. The Auxiliarist of the Year award went to MarcelinoAlemania of the 101st Squadron, CGADNCRCL. It was a proud day for the PCGA indeed.

Kofi Annan once said: "If our hopes of building a better and safer world are to become more than wishful thinking, we will need the engagement of VOLUNTEERSmore than ever."




